Create opportunities for ownership & recognition

- Student music council
- Tri-M

Sponsor social events (student planned & run?)

Promote open & inclusive practices

- Neutral concert attire
- Program a wide variety of composers & styles

Break down barriers for participation

- Financial, time, transportation
- Social/Emotional: Buddy system



COMMUNITY FROM THE INSIDE-OUT: Administrators & Families

Promote clear communication with administrators & families

Create opportunities for administrator & family participation

- Concerts, Field Trips, Fundraisers, etc.

Foster structured booster organizations for those with time & energy to volunteer

Partner & communicate with existing organizations in your footprint



COMMUNITY FROM THE INSIDE-OUT: Future Musicians

Embrace the RPS feeder reality... find reasons to pool time, resources, energy, & students!

Potential for in- or after-school partnerships and/or field trips?

- Regular, scheduled lessons/sectionals
- Concerts for & with potential feeders
- Side-by-side playing... even informal!
- Stand tunes at football games
